Cárdenas was elected to Congress in 2012 and has been reelected every two years since. He did not seek reelection in 2024.

Cárdenas's state reforms brought 78,000 new classroom seats and 15 playgrounds throughout Los Angeles. He also secured more than \$650 million for new school construction.

He authored legislation that reformed California's gang prevention and intervention programs and teamed up with fellow Democrat Adam Schiff to create the Schiff-Cárdenas Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act.

Edward James "Ed" Begley Jr. is an American actor and environmental activist. He has appeared in hundreds of films, television shows, and stage performances.





It is an honor to announce that Detective Brandon McConnell and Police Officer II Eric Peltier have been selected as the 2024 North Hollywood "Detectives of the Year."

Detective Brandon McConnell has dedicated over 16 years of service to the City of Los Angeles. Since his promotion to Detective in 2022, he has been a key member of the North Hollywood Burglary Unit, where he investigates both residential and commercial burglary series. His expertise and unwavering commitment to solving complex cases have made him an invaluable asset to the team.

2024 DETECTIVES OF THE YEAR

Officer Eric Peltier, with over 28 years of service to Los Angeles, including 24 years within the North Hollywood community, has demonstrated extraordinary skill and dedication. Officer Peltier's primary responsibility in the Burglary Unit is to secure and analyze surveillance footage, a critical element in identifying suspects and building cases. His meticulous attention to detail has been instrumental in advancing investigations.

Since they began working together in 2022, McConnell and Peltier have formed an outstanding crime-fighting partnership. Their ability to identify patterns and link burglaries with similar modius operandi (MO) has led to significant breakthroughs in numerous cases. Their investigations, often long and complex, required persistence, professionalism, and countless hours of detailed work. Together, they have authored more than 50 search warrants and spent extensive time conducting cellular telephone analysis, leading to critical evidence in numerous cases.

Through their teamwork and tireless efforts, McConnell and Peltier successfully uncovered and dismantled 11 prolific burglary crews responsible for over 251 burglaries across multiple jurisdictions. Their hard work has resulted in over 16 arrests, with additional suspects identified and actively being pursued. Their ongoing investigations into four more burglary crews reflect their unwavering determination to leave no case unresolved.

The reach of their work extends beyond the LAPD, with the successful apprehension of suspects who have committed crimes throughout Southern California, including cities such as Burbank, Glendale, Santa Clarita, San Bernardino, Ventura, and Palmdale. Their dedication has also had a significant impact across multiple LAPD divisions, including the Valley, West, and South Bureaus.

Recognizing the importance of collaboration, McConnell and Peltier have worked closely with external agencies such as the Los Angeles District Attorney's Office, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Burglary Robbery Task Force, and the Los Angeles Impact Unit. Their seamless coordination with these partners ensured that suspects operating across jurisdictions were brought to justice, further contributing to public safety.

Both Officer Peltier and Detective McConnell epitomize the LAPD Core Values of "Service to Our Communities," "Respect for People," and "Reverence for the Law." Their investigative excellence, combined with their commitment to fostering collaboration, exemplifies the Department's dedication to creating safer communities, free from fear and crime.


Pat also seems to find time to continue to cook for her church groups and events, as well as volunteering for "Hope the Mission" serving meals for the unhoused.

CAPTAIN KATHERINE MEDRANO NORTH HOLLYWOOD DIVISION



The Specialized Unit Officer of the Year for 2024 is an honor and distinction which is awarded to Police Officer III Pedro "Jesse" Ramirez, Serial No. #39235. Jesse joined the Narcotics Enforcement Detail (NED) in 2018. In fact, Jesse was hand-selected for the Unit. His work ethic, energy, and enthusiasm were qualities that were recognized right away and it was obvious he would be a great fit for the Unit. Jesse has proven, many times over, he was the right choice for the Narcotics Enforcement Detail.

North Hollywood Division is approximately 25 square miles and serves over 220,000 community members. The primary responsibility of the Narcotics Enforcement Detail is investigating narcotics related complaints and offenses. However, NED also plays a major supporting role by providing assistance with surveillance operations, intelligence gathering, search warrant service, and participation in various violent crime reduction task forces, to name a few examples. With only two officers and one supervisor, the Unit must operate efficiently and effectively. Jesse's contributions have met this standard on a daily basis.

At the beginning of March, this year, Jesse's partner was transferred to another division after receiving a promotion. This, essentially, doubled Jesse's workload until his new partner joined the Unit. Throughout that time, Jesse continued to work diligently, tirelessly, and never complained or slowed down. Instead, he accepted the challenge and pushed himself even harder. Failure was not an option for Jesse. When his new partner finally joined him in June, Jesse was not only responsible for his own workload but also had to train the newest addition to NED. Being one of the most versatile and highly trained units of the LAPD, there are a vast number of responsibilities, topics, scenarios, and strategies to cover. Jesse was ready for and took on the assignment with great enthusiasm. Jesse demonstrated his knowledge, ability to train and provide guidance which ultimately led to his upgrade this year from Police Officer II to Police Officer III making his official title "Training Officer".

As personnel resources continue to diminish, NED has also been tasked with filing all narcotics related arrests, in North Hollywood Division, with the District and City Attorney's Offices. This alone is a full-time job for one officer especially when taking into consideration North Hollywood NED is also responsible for handling all arrests made by Transit Services Division officers at the Metro Red and Orange Lines. No other division in the Valley shares this responsibility or workload. Yet, Jesse has taken charge to do so which is evidence of his organizational skills, productivity, and leadership.

If that was not enough, Jesse is also the captain of the North Hollywood Division Running Team and has taken on the added responsibility of organizing various running events including the First Responder Relay and Baker to Vegas Relay Race.
